This report provides a summary of many arrests, incidents, events and other items of significance occurring in Bloomfield Township. However, it does not include every incident reported to the Police Department. It is possible for publicity to hinder some criminal investigations. In these situations, we do not release information unless it is in the community's best interest or we are certain it will not compromise an investigation.

Summary:

During the timeframe of December 15, 2025, through December 21, 2025, Bloomfield Township Officers handled 595 calls for service, 171 of which were traffic stops.

Traffic Crashes:

Officers investigated 59 total traffic crashes during this timeframe: 40 Property Damage Crashes, 6 Personal Injury Crashes, 9 Hit and Run Crashes, 4 Private Property Crashes, 0 Car vs. Deer Crashes, and 0 Non-UD-10 Crashes.

25-26231 Breaking and Entering 5100 block of Windingwood Drive

On December 19, 2025, the Bloomfield Township Police Department took a report of a Home Invasion in the 5100 block of Windingwood Drive. The homeowners stated that they returned home and discovered multiple pieces of jewelry stolen from the bedroom closet. The home invasion occurred between 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. Officers checked the home and did not see any signs of obvious forced entry. It is believed that the garage door was left open to the home. This case was assigned to the Bloomfield Township Police Investigation's Unit and is currently under investigation. 25-26044 Larceny from Automobile 3500 block of Middlebury Lane

On December 17, 2025, the Bloomfield Township Police Department took a report for a Larceny from Automobile in the area of the 3500 block of Middlebury Lane. The larceny occurred during the overnight hours from December 16, 2025, to December 17, 2025. Personal items including sunglasses and clothes were stolen. There were no signs of forced entry to the vehicle and it is believed that the vehicle was left unlocked. 25-26032 UDAA (Vehicle Theft) 5200 block of Pon Valley Drive

On December 17, 2025, the Bloomfield Township Police Department took a report of a stolen vehicle from the 5200 block of Pon Valley Drive that occurred during the overnight hours. The victim's 2024 Lincoln Navigator was stolen from the driveway. The vehicle was unlocked and the keys were inside. On December 18, 2025, the Bloomfield Township Police Department received notice from Detroit Police that the vehicle was recovered in their jurisdiction. The vehicle was intact and there was no significant damage. The vehicle was processed for evidence; no suspects are in custody at this time. This case remains under investigation. We remind our resident to lock their car doors, remove all valuables, and never leave the keys inside the vehicle.

25-26014 Larceny from Automobile 2139 S. Telegraph Road (TJ Maxx)

On December 16, 2025, the Bloomfield Township Police Department was dispatched to TJ Maxx, 2139 S Telegraph Road, for a Larceny from Automobile report. The victim stated that while she was in TJ Maxx from 10:00 p.m. until 10:45 p.m. someone entered her vehicle and stole \$350.00 worth of Christmas gifts. The victim was adamant that the vehicle was locked, but there was no sign of forced entry. The Bloomfield Township Police Department reminds our residents to lock their cars and not leave any valuables inside.

25-25981 Retail Fraud ARREST 2400 S Telegraph Road

On December 16, 2025, at approximately 3:45 p.m., the Bloomfield Township Police Department responded to Target, 2400 S Telegraph Road, for a Retail Fraud in progress. A black female with three children ranging from infant to a 6-year-old was seen inside the store removing tags from items. The female was observed going through the self-check-out where she scanned some but not all items. The female was stopped by officers as she was leaving the store and identified as Destiny Alford, a 24-year-old female out of Waterford. Alford had \$515 worth of merchandise including bras, clothing, phone chargers, headphones, backpacks, and a blanket. Alford was placed under arrest for Retail Fraud. This case was presented to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office who reviewed the complaint and issued a one-count arrest warrant for Retail Fraud 2nd Degree. Alford was arraigned at the 48th District Court in front of Magistrate Nelson-Klein and given a \$10,000/10% bond.
